The San Francisco Opera will hold auditions in October and November for experienced, classically trained singers seeking a professional contract in the highly acclaimed San Francisco Opera Chorus for 2025. **There are multiple Full-Time Positions open in the Regular Chorus, as well as many Extra Chorus opportunities for all voice types, with a particular need for Tenors, Baritones, and Basses. Applicants from underrepresented backgrounds are encouraged to apply.**

Musical rehearsals are currently scheduled to begin in the spring of 2025 with the season ending in early December. A tentative *Chorus Master Schedule* will be provided with any offer of employment.

Audition appointments are confirmed by invitation only.

Invited applicants will demonstrate the following:

- A minimum of 4 years classical voice training.
- Excellent sight-reading ability in music and languages.
- Ability to memorize music quickly.
- Experience in another professional opera or symphony chorus and/or strong academic or other non-professional experience.
- Stage experience or significant stage training.
- Availability to work a complex & rigorous rehearsal and performance schedule.
