Key Characters:

Eugene Oegin—A taciturn aristocrat

Tatyana—A young woman with unrequited feelings for Oegin

Lensky—Oegin's friend, a poet

Olga—Tatyana's younger sister, in a relationship with Lensky

Listen for: In the opera's final act, Oegin is overcome with ardent feelings; he claims to be poisoned with desire for Tatyana. His music at that point corresponds directly to Tatyana's in Act I when she pours her passion for Oegin into a letter.

ACCESSIBILITY

San Francisco Opera is committed to providing easy access for all of our patrons. Need assistance for a future performance? Please contact the Opera Box Office prior to your visit so that we can ensure your comfort.

For patrons using wheelchairs, San Francisco Opera offers wheelchair-accessible seats at a range of prices. All entrances at the War Memorial Opera House are wheelchair accessible. Wheelchair-accessible stalls in restrooms can be found on all floors (except the Main Lobby and 5th floor Balcony levels). Accessible drinking fountains are located on all floors except the Balcony level.

COAT CHECK

Check your coat at the North and South ends of the main lobby. For the safety and comfort of our audience, large bags are strongly discouraged and are subject to search.

Headsets that provide a spoken version of the supertitles are available at the North Lobby coat check.

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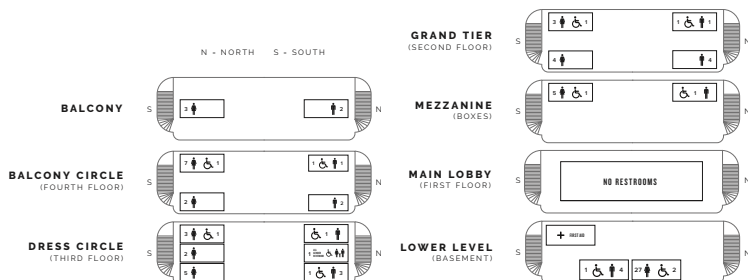

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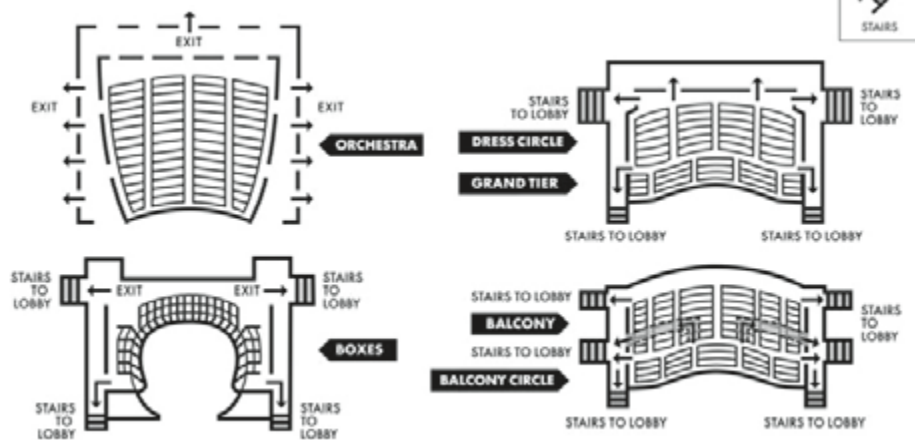

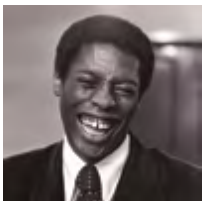

DMITRI SHOSTAKOVICH'S *LADY MACBETH OF MTSENSK*

Kurt Herbert Adler presented *Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk* starring **Anja Silja** (center) as the centerpiece of his 28th and final season in 1981 as general director of San Francisco Opera. He entrusted the baton to his protégé **Calvin Simmons**, a versatile musician and rising star in the classical music world. One year after leading this incisive performance, Simmons died in a tragic boating accident. He was 32.

Once again, the unprecedented generosity of Cynthia and John Gunn has set the stage for a dazzling season at San Francisco Opera.

Since 2002, when John joined the Opera Board, the couple has underwritten numerous productions and provided exceptional support for many of the Company's innovative endeavors. In September 2008, the Gunns made a historic commitment—believed to be the largest gift ever made by individuals to an American opera company—to help fund the signature projects of General Director David Gockley, including new operas and productions, multimedia projects, and outreach programs, and they have proudly continued that support for General Director Matthew Shilvock. This season, the Gunns' inspired generosity is helping make possible four productions—*Antony and Cleopatra*, *Eugene Onegin*, *La Traviata*, and *El último sueño de Frida y Diego*. The Gunns invite everyone to give and join them as a member of San Francisco Opera's donor community. John comments, "Opera is a dynamic art form, and all of us play a role in keeping it a meaningful part of our social fabric. With you we can propel San Francisco Opera into its next 100 years

of artistic history." John is the former chairman and CEO of Dodge & Cox Investment Managers. He joined the firm in 1972, the year he received his MBA from Stanford Business School and married Cynthia, who graduated from Stanford with an A.B. in political science in 1970. Early in her career, Cynthia was the editor and director of The Portable Stanford book series for ten years. She edited twenty-eight books by Stanford professors on a vast array of topics, including *Economic Policy Beyond the Headlines* by George Shultz and Ken Dam. In addition to their support of San Francisco Opera, the Gunns are active members of the community. John is a former trustee of Stanford University and is Chairman Emeritus of the Advisory Board for the Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research. Cynthia currently serves as a trustee of the Fine Arts Museums and is a former overseer of Stanford's Hoover Institution and has been a member of the advisory board of Family and Children Services and the board of the Lucile Packard Foundation for Children's Health. Opera lovers are grateful to Cynthia and John and applaud their commitment to keeping San Francisco Opera a leading-edge company.

ranching area. She attended Stanford University, graduating cum laude with a degree in history. She served as the president of the Carol Franc Buck Foundation since its inception, was an original director of the Frank and Eva Buck Foundation, and was a valued board member of San Francisco Opera from 1981-2022. Matthew Shilvock says, “Creating opera with Carol was a joyful blessing. She had such a nuanced understanding of the art form and how we could propel it forward. She developed lasting and deep connections with artists and had great respect for the intensity of their work. And in her philanthropy and partnership she did so much to celebrate the vital role culture plays in the Bay Area. It was a privilege to know her. We miss her dearly but will feel the impact of her extraordinary spirit for decades to come.”



The Edgar Foster Daniels Foundation (Production Sponsor, *Antony and Cleopatra*)

The Edgar Foster Daniels Foundation was established in 1996 by philanthropist Edgar Foster Daniels. The Foundation’s focus is to provide support to American and international opera companies. Mr. Daniels, who passed away in August 2020, served on the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Opera, San Francisco Opera, Santa Fe Opera (honorary director), and Los Angeles Opera and was a lifetime board member of Lyric Opera of Chicago. Bertie Bialek Elliott (Production Sponsor, *Antony and Cleopatra*)

Roberta "Bertie" Bialek Elliott has a long history of volunteerism and philanthropic support on the Monterey Peninsula, in the Bay Area, and at her alma mater Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. Bertie was born in Omaha, Nebraska and graduated from Northwestern in 1954 with a degree in History and Phi Beta Kappa honors. In 1963 she and her then-husband moved to Carmel, California to raise their family. Bertie was an early investor in Berkshire Hathaway, founded by her brother, legendary investor Warren Buffett. Bertie and her three daughters established the Berkshire Foundation in 1996 and have supported many organizations and institutions through it. Bertie has served on the boards of the Monterey Bay Aquarium, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Monterey County Symphony Association, Carmel Bach Festival, Community Foundation for Monterey County, and the

Community Hospital of the Monterey Peninsula. Most recently Bertie helped the Community Hospital in establishing the Ohana Center for Child and Adolescent Behavioral Health. Bertie has supported the San Francisco Opera for more than 20 years and is a big fan of John Adams. Bertie sponsored his *Girls of the Golden West* in 2017 and was a commissioning sponsor of *Doctor Atomic* in 2005.

Jerome L. & Thao N. Dodson (Production Sponsor, *Eugene Onegin*)

"A fiery horse with the speed of light, a cloud of dust and a hearty, Hi-Yo, Silver!" Those words, accompanied by the galloping excitement of Rossini's *William Tell* Overture, transfixed a young Jerry Dodson as he listened to *The Lone Ranger* on the family radio in Oak Park, Illinois. Just as Bugs Bunny's *Rabbit of Seville* had done for many, a lighthearted entertainment sparked a future operatic devotion. That little boy grew up to attend Berkeley in the '60s, serve with the American Embassy in Vietnam where he and Thao met, and attend Harvard Business School. Eventually, the couple married, settled in the Bay Area, and raised a family. In the 1980s, Jerry was a pioneer in the field of socially responsible investing, with little interest in opera. But in 1992, when San Francisco Opera

decided to celebrate Rossini's bicentennial with the rarely performed *William Tell*, Thao, already an opera lover, suggested to Jerry that they go. *William Tell* was praised for its striking Lotfi Mansouri production, and the Dodsons began attending regularly. They became season ticket holders in 1999 and supporters, "in a small way," as Jerry puts it. A friendship with David Gockley, which endures to this day, led to a larger role as Company Sponsors. "I so admired what he did for the opera, but it was not very good for my pocketbook," Jerry laughs. Jerry also lends his financial expertise to the audit committee. In 2016, Dodson considered the import of Gockley's departure. He met with Matthew Shilvock and joined the Board that year. "We hit it off right away!" Jerry says. He felt a similar affinity with Keith Geeslin (President of the San Francisco Opera Association). Eager to continue their support, the Dodsons see the Centennial Season as a perfect time to revitalize and energize the Company within the San Francisco community. The initial fire ignited by *William Tell* continues to burn brightly.

Bob has been a longtime supporter of contemporary opera since he became a member of the board of directors in 2001. 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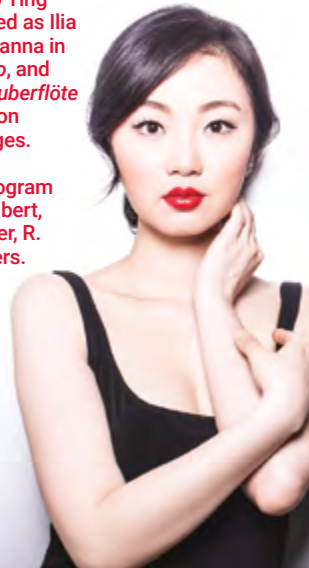

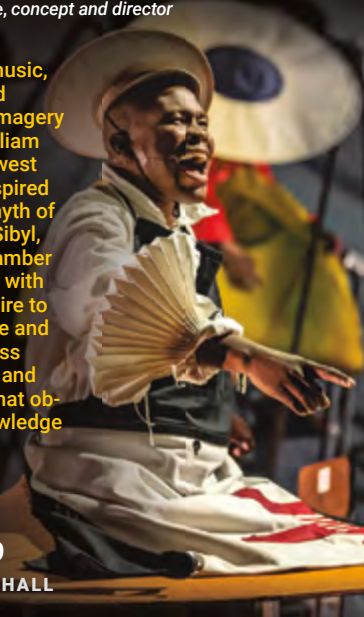

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Instigating Opera

“Opera is an art form that tries to build towards the sublime,” reflected writer-director **Samantha Gorman** during the opening session of the Instigators last June, when six remarkable thinkers and artists eagerly accepted San Francisco Opera’s invitation to dive headlong into the world of opera, kicking off the Company’s bold multidisciplinary program to help pioneer future directions for the field. Exploring new ground is something Gorman and her LA-based studio, TenderClaws, seek to do in immersive spaces and emerging media including AR [augmented reality] and VR [virtual reality], often with live performers.

This rumination—on the beauty and power of opera, how and what the art form traditionally has been and for whom, and what it might yet become—was part of an expansive,

lively conversation that unfurled over five days of immersive introductory activities hosted by San Francisco Opera for the Instigators. In addition to field trips to the Company’s scenic and costume shops and to the Institute of the Future in Palo Alto, the Instigators met with luminaries such as director Peter Sellars, composer Jake Heggie, librettist Roxie Perkins, and animation-VR creator Saschka Unseld. Exchanging ideas with a range of Company artists, artisans, and staff, they took part in hands-on activities around the Opera House and attended rehearsals and performances. It is all part of the San Francisco Opera’s collective effort, with support from the Creative Edge Fund, to tap creative leaders from a range of disciplines to infuse the Company, the art form, and the community with unexpected ideas.

Jad Abumrad, the storyteller-musician-journalist whose

groundbreaking podcasts include *Radiolab*, mused on the interplay between power and scale: “You can have the smallest story, but as soon as it’s on a stage and it’s set to music, you feel like these people are 30 feet tall. Audio [storytelling] is very much about intimacy and about a one-to-one connection ... is there a way that something can be operatic and also as intimate as a podcast?”

For architect, designer, and software engineer **Peter Zuspan**, whose firm, Bureau V, designs performance spaces and engages in artist collaborations, bigness is one of the things that draws him to opera (which he studied as a singer): “Just the scale of it is so important. That part is a really important thing for me, as a designer thinking about space all the time.”

Open-ended inquiry is at the heart of this new initiative, notes San Francisco Opera General Director **Matthew Shilvoek**. “There’s this willingness in the Bay Area to tread into unknown territory and see exciting things result, of pushing boundaries and being willing to do the unthinkable,” he told the Instigators. “I’ve long wished that we as a cultural organization could embody more of that sensibility. Because of where we are in the world, we should be able to tap into that mindset in a way that really nobody else can—unencumbered by the reality of the traditional side of what we do, without a fixed end goal.”

The initiative supports one- or two-year inquiries in a lab-like framework. With goalposts a fluid concept, the Instigators’ inquiry may take many forms, from research and experiments to workshops and prototypes, drawing upon expertise and partnerships with people from inside and outside the field of opera.

East Bay chef, educator, and author **Bryant Terry** has long admired how opera brings together so many different

genres but wondered about the role of the audience: “In a lot of European art forms, the norm is that as a viewer, you’re a very passive recipient. But in a lot of diasporic Black cultures, there’s this norm of interacting with the performance: you’re giving them energy, they’re giving you energy. And so there’s this kind of dialogue and interplay.”

Interplay and participation have always deeply informed the work of writer-scenographer-director **Abhishek Majumdar**, artistic director of Bangalore’s Nalanda Arts Studio. Referencing Asian forms such as Jatra, Lhamo opera, and Bengali opera, he asked, “How does [opera] connect to your life outside? And what’s the connection between that life and this life? Do you find your stories, and does this inform your life?”

Design technologist-researcher **Paula Te**, who explores how the design of interfaces and interactions can augment human learning and enable creative expression, inquired, “How can opera be something that’s more than a consumptive experience and feel more like something we’re participating in? What might it look like if audience members felt like their lived experiences were reflected in opera?”

As the Instigators—abetted by the Company’s Director of Innovation Programs Lee Helms, Instigators Curator Elena Park, and Creative Advisor Jocelyn Clarke—begin to tackle these and many more questions, they’ll help to dream a future for opera that we can only begin to imagine. 🌱

THE FUTURE OF OPERA

Antony and Cleopatra

ACT I

SCENE 1: Cleopatra's bedroom in Alexandria. Antony is barely recovered from the previous night's festivities. She taunts him about his Roman wife, Fulvia, and needles him repeatedly about "the scarce-bearded Caesar." Realizing he must temporarily return to Rome, Antony affirms his love for her, to which she responds with scorn and self-pity.

SCENE 2: In Rome Caesar voices his disgust for Antony's shirking of duties in Egypt while he, Caesar, has to deal with a mounting insurrection. Antony arrives, greeted by a chilly, annoyed Caesar. A heated argument ensues. Agrippa makes a surprise proposal: that Antony marry Octavia, Caesar's sister, who has recently become a widow. To everyone's astonishment Antony agrees.

Enobarbus describes the fantastic scene when Antony first met Cleopatra in Cydnus, her glamorous arrival, dressed as Aphrodite, on her barge with its perfumed, purple sails, and her irresistible magnetism. ("Age cannot wither her, nor custom stale her infinite variety.")

SCENE 3: Back in Alexandria, Cleopatra lounges by the pool, pining away theatrically for Antony. Eros arrives with news of Antony's marriage to Octavia. Cleopatra erupts in a rage. Unwilling to hear the truth she continues to ask the same question, "Is he married?"

SCENE 4: Antony, humiliated by Caesar and forced to move to Athens in order to isolate him and minimize his influence, resolves to make preparations for war against him. Now officially Antony's wife, Octavia voices her frustration at being caught in the middle of the two men she loves. She must choose between her husband and her brother. Perhaps she already senses Antony will abandon her.

An infuriated Caesar receives the news that Antony and Cleopatra are back together again and behaving in flagrant disregard of Rome, Antony "bestowing" Cyprus, Lydia, and Syria to her as if he had the power to do so. Caesar is interrupted by the surprise appearance of his pregnant sister Octavia, who has fled back to Rome. Insulted now two-fold, Caesar declares war against Antony.

SCENE 5 (The Battle of Actium): Despite the fact that his navy is cobbled together from inexperienced sailors and inadequate vessels, Antony is exuberant, savoring the return of his long-lost military prowess. His pride is such

that he believes he can win any contest. Cleopatra has provided sixty of her own Egyptian warships. The naval battle goes poorly for Antony and, at a critical moment, Cleopatra inexplicably recalls her ships. Worse still, Antony draws back his navy and flees, following hers. The result is catastrophic.

Alone on the deck of his ship, Antony rues his fascination with Cleopatra and blames her as well as himself for the catastrophic outcome of the battle. ("All is lost! This foul Egyptian has betrayed me.")

ACT II

SCENE 1: Returned to Egypt, Antony and Cleopatra replay the devastating lost sea battle. She is contrite for having withdrawn her ships from the battle, never having suspected he would follow her. His military power, he says, has been neutered by his love for her. He will now have to send entreaties to the young Caesar, a galling humiliation for Antony, the once celebrated warrior.

In Rome Caesar reads petitions from both Antony and Cleopatra, both bowing to his authority and begging his mercy. He orders Agrippa to go to Alexandria and convince Cleopatra to abandon Antony.

Agrippa, now in Alexandria, meets alone with Cleopatra to present Caesar's proposal. She responds ambiguously while Agrippa flamboyantly kisses her hand. Antony, having observed this, interrupts and orders Agrippa to be whipped. In a blistering diatribe, Antony unloads on Cleopatra—"the false soul of Egypt"—accusing her of duplicity and lack of faith in him. Charmian urges her queen to flee to safety in the monument (a fortified tower).

SCENE 2: Caesar gives a rousing speech to the populace, proclaiming Rome's absolute dominance over the known world. A chorus of "vox populi" hail his ascendance. This signals the end of the Republic and with it, the rise of the Roman Empire and Caesar's transformation to Emperor Augustus.

SCENE 3: Cleopatra, returned to her court, bids her maid Iras to go to Antony and inform him that she, Cleopatra, has committed suicide out of remorse. It is a ruse on her part, intended to recapture his attention. But Antony believes this false information and, in despair, orders his

loyal servant Eros to help him commit suicide. Eros refuses, killing himself instead, forcing Antony to carry out the act alone. But Antony bumbles it. Charmian arrives, is shocked to see him writhing in agony, and tells him that Cleopatra is indeed still alive. Cleopatra, up to now afraid to leave the security of the monument, is unable to resist coming to Antony. She rushes to his side in a state of extreme remorse and despair. With great effort the women carry his heavy, nearly lifeless body up the stairs to the safety of the monument. He is failing, and she is beside herself. (“Noblest of men, wilt thou die? Hast thou no care of me?”) Antony dies in her arms.

SCENE 4: A triumphant Caesar dispatches Maecenas to go to Cleopatra and offer official forgiveness, although his ulterior motive is to exhibit her in Rome as a victory trophy. There is now no hope of escape for Cleopatra. Maecenas arrives in Alexandria with Caesar’s patronizing message. (“Be of good cheer. You’ve fallen into a princely hand; fear nothing.”) But Roman soldiers suddenly seize Cleopatra, who reacts by attempting to stab herself.

Maecenas orders them to release her, but not before he admits to Cleopatra that Caesar will indeed parade her in humiliation through the streets of Rome.

Cleopatra commands her women to bring her finest clothes, her crown, and her jewels. A peasant brings a basket that contains several poisonous asps. Each of the women lies back and applies an asp to her body. Cleopatra imagines she hears Antony call. (“I see him rouse himself to praise my noble act. I hear him mock the luck of Caesar.”)

She dies.

ANTONY AND CLEOPATRA—GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Triumvir: One of the three public officers unofficially responsible for the Roman Republic.

Incarnate Isis: Following ancient Egyptian traditions, Cleopatra identified to the public as Isis, goddess of motherhood and the afterlife. She also identified with the Roman goddess Venus.

Dionysus: Greek god of fertility, wine, and pleasures. Mark Antony identified publicly as the “New Dionysus.”

Hercules: Antony, also identified with the demigod Hercules, known for his physique, bravery, and military successes.

Apollo: Roman God of “Divine Distance,” religion, and law. Octavian adopted Apollo as his patron god, attributing his victory at Actium to the god’s divine intervention.

Eastern star: The goddess Venus and Cleopatra.

Donations of Alexandria: A celebration and political act (34 BCE) by Cleopatra and Mark Antony in which they distributed Roman territories to Cleopatra’s children and recognized Cleopatra’s son, Caesarion, as the son of Julius Caesar.

Battle of Actium: The culminating naval battle (31 BCE, Greece) in the rivalry of Octavian against Mark Antony and Cleopatra. Octavian emerged victorious, signaling a new age, the Roman Empire.

Latium: Part of Italy.

Sicyon: Part of Greece.

River of Cydnus: The river in Turkey where Cleopatra and Antony first met.

Mandragora: A narcotic, from the mandrake plant.

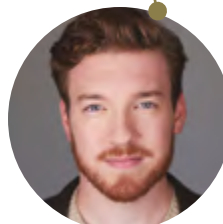

TRIUMPH

The Roman triumph was a civil ceremony and religious rite in ancient Rome, held to publicly sanctify the success of a military commander who led Roman forces to victory or, in some historical traditions, had successfully completed a foreign war.

After her defeat at the battle of Actium in 31 BCE, Cleopatra feared she would be paraded in the streets of Rome as part of Octavian's official triumph. To avoid this disgrace and likely exile or execution, she took her own life.

Antony and Cleopatra

Every new opera has its own distinctive journey. My journey with *Antony and Cleopatra* began over four years ago when John Adams invited me to direct his new version of this famous story. John and I, working with dramaturg Lucia Scheckner, began with Shakespeare's text, along with *Life of Antony*, Plutarch's account of the two lovers and their adversary, Octavian. To process Shakespeare's play, with its 42 scenes and 40 characters, we took a forensic, analytical approach, laying each act out on a giant sheet of butcher paper and color coding the main characters' text. We spread them out on a giant table, examining them like detectives solving a mystery. It was always clear to us that Antony, Cleopatra, and Octavian were the primary figures around which our story would unfold and, as we focused on them and condensed scenes, several of Shakespeare's themes emerged as guides: the individual versus the crown; artifice versus reality; the real world versus the stage; Rome versus Egypt; and monarchy versus republic. It was also evident that most of Shakespeare's great scenes occur in private, away from the public eye, with people making good, bad, and ugly choices that directly impact one another and then reverberate out into the world.

This toggling between private and public is the central structure for the flow of the opera's scenes. *Antony and Cleopatra* is an enormous story of nations and rulers whose actions changed the course of history. All three of these outsized figures claimed divine descentance from gods and goddesses—Cleopatra was Isis/Aphrodite incarnate, Antony was a 'modern' Hercules, and Octavian claimed Apollo as his ancestor. Yet it is also an intimate story of lovers destroyed by a ruthless, rising Emperor.

My way into this story was through Cleopatra, for whom I have a deep affection. What's not to love about a woman who carved out space for herself as a leader in a male dominated world and did it with such spectacular confidence that she still burns bright in the public imagination some two thousand years later? Seeing someone leave such an indelible mark on history and doing it with such power, grace, beauty, and wisdom is thrilling. In Cleopatra, famous for her "infinite variety," Shakespeare created one of the greatest female characters in his entire canon.

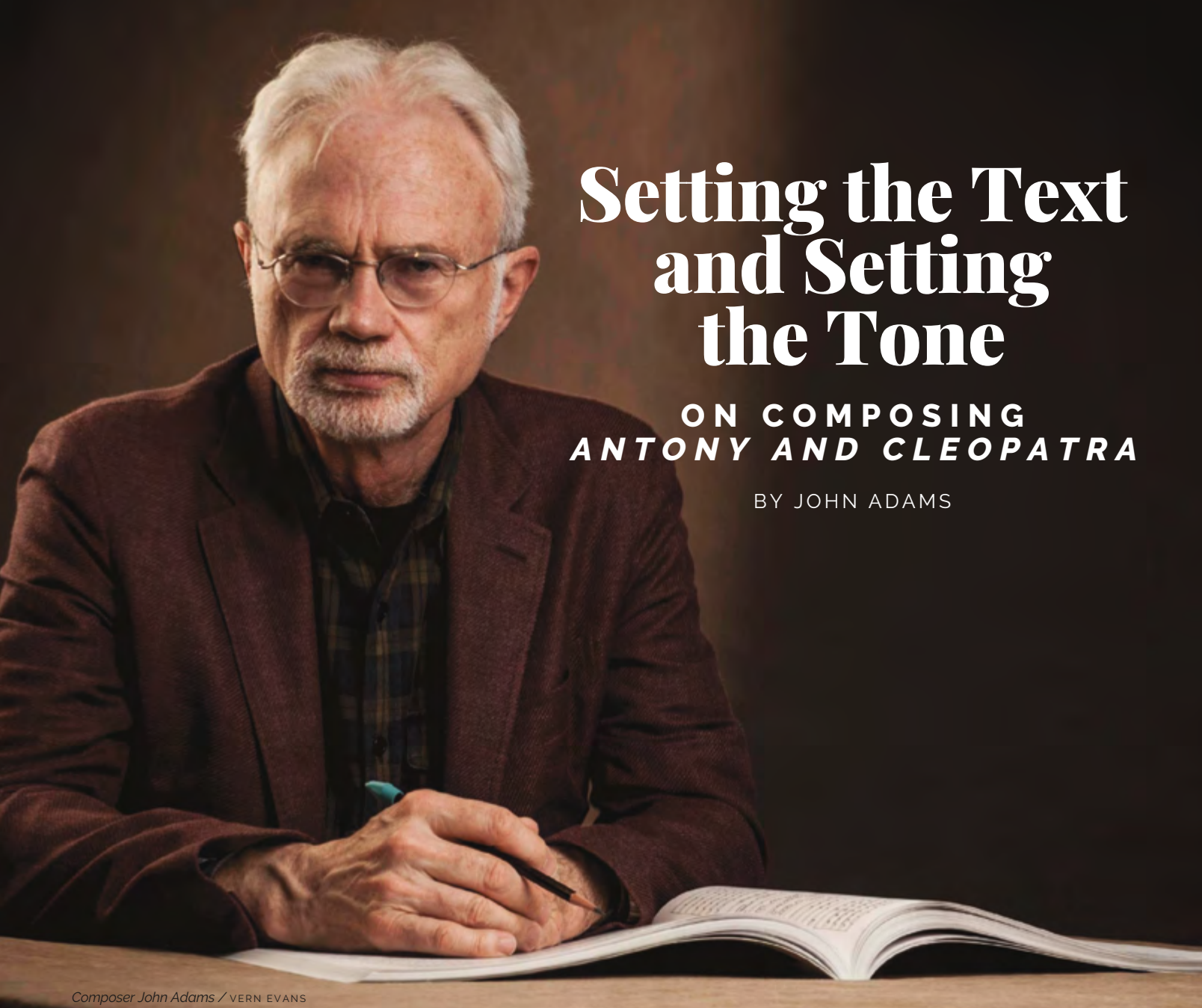
As John worked to craft his score and libretto, I turned my attention toward the creative team and the design. We knew we would live in a world where Egyptian and

Greek/Roman Gods still exist. We cast our eyes back to 30 BCE and looked to the incredible artifacts of Ancient Rome and Egypt for inspiration. As we developed the production, we began to tease out themes of public vs. private and artifice vs. real by exploring how the public self is fabricated and amplified through media and image. In updating the setting, we chose to invoke the Golden Age of Hollywood, which feels particularly apt, given how cinematic depictions of these characters have become enmeshed with the genre's own history and still influence modern perceptions.

At heart, *Antony and Cleopatra* is a love story. In a world of political machinations and carefully crafted public personas, we ultimately behold two wizened lovers who remain true to each other to the end, despite tectonic blows of adversity and imminent death. Throughout their journey, they are glamorous—even fabulous!—inspiring us with their zest for life and their grace in dying, on their own terms. I'm grateful for the opportunity to bring these three famous people to life once again amplified in the public imagination to mythic status, and yet always deeply human. 🌟



Setting the Text and Setting the Tone

ON COMPOSING *ANTONY AND CLEOPATRA*

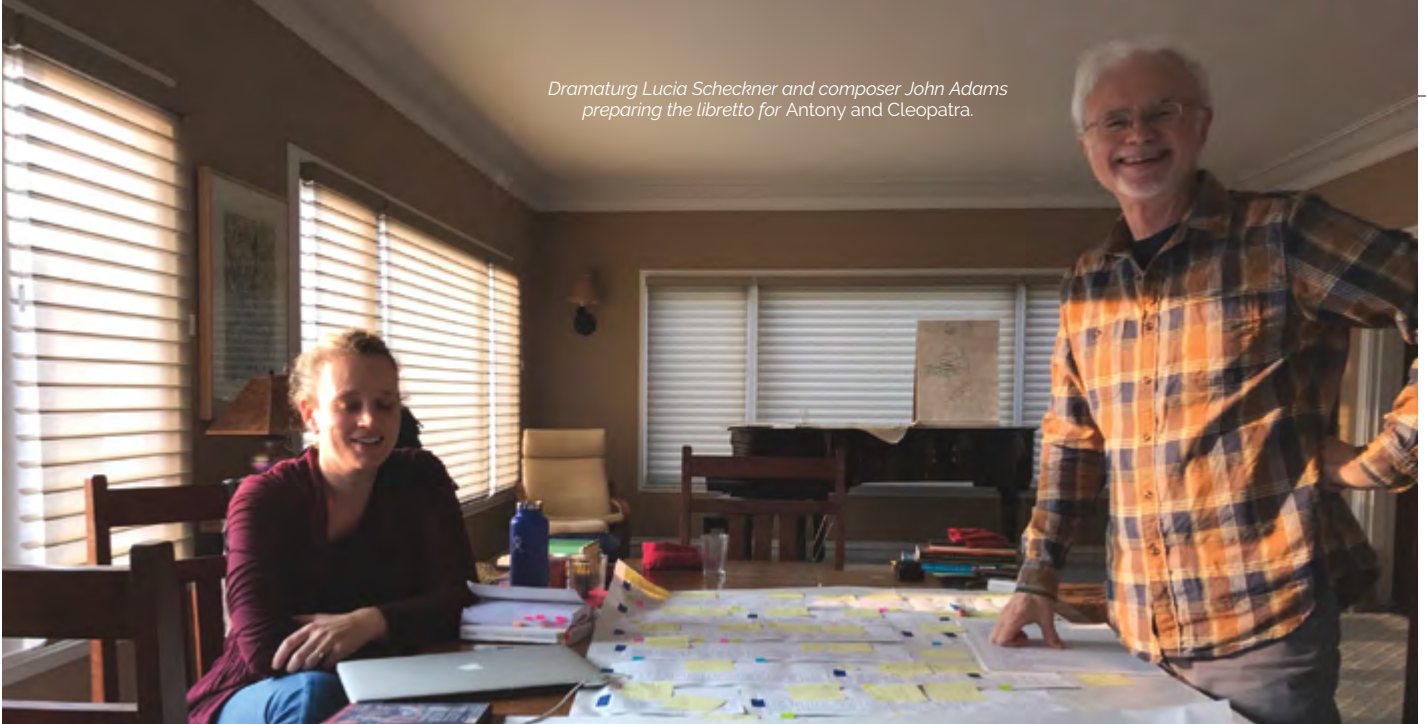

Of all Shakespeare's dramas, *Antony and Cleopatra* is surely the most thematically and formally complex. The two names that grace its title are instantly recognizable, especially for the generations of Americans who, while they may not have read nor seen the play, have nonetheless grown up with well over a century of cinematic evocations of these willful, transgressive lovers. Newcomers to the play will immediately encounter an often bickering couple and perhaps wonder whether their oscillating, bruising relationship is even worth feeling their pain. In Shakespeare's version they are two mature adults, light years removed from the virginal youths of *Romeo and Juliet*, and each has a provocative back story—he one of

the greatest of Roman commanders, in his heyday arrogant and self-assured but now drifting into a comfortable decadence; and she a brilliant, alluring, and politically savvy queen who, years before and though still a teenager, had captured the attention of Julius Caesar and had a child by him. They are, in short, two people who have “been there, done that,” having committed acts both heroic and despicable simply to survive in the brutal world of their time, when hiring an assassin to resolve a family dispute would raise no eyebrows.

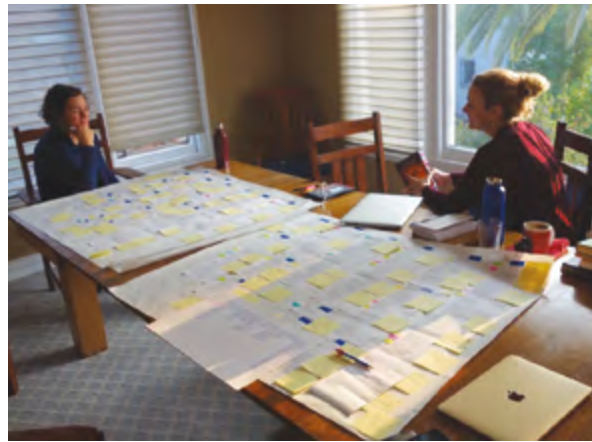
As a stage spectacle the play's sprawling, at times confusing, scenario (three continents, 40 characters and 42 scenes, a dynasty in decline and a nascent empire in first bloom) conjures a panorama of political intrigue, military



strategy, a literal clash of civilizations. While it may lack the blunt concision of *Macbeth* and the sustained eloquence of *Hamlet* and *Lear*, as a study of power, both between individuals as well as between nations, *Antony and Cleopatra* feels uniquely and psychologically modern. This is why I chose it and why I feel that, despite its ancient source and setting, it is an apt companion of *Nixon in China*, *The Death of Klinghoffer*, and *Doctor Atomic*.

In *Girls of the Golden West* I set several short soliloquies from *Macbeth*, research having suggested that Shakespeare was a popular form of entertainment during the California Gold Rush. That experience with the Bard whetted my appetite, and I, like so many other composers, engaged the risky challenge of setting to music not only his language but also negotiating the twists and turns of his dramatic plans. I was of course aware that Samuel Barber had his own operatic version of the play, but I didn't think that one composer could or should "own" a myth as archetypal as this one any more than one could own *Faust* or, for that matter, the Passion story. It was no sign of disrespect that I purposely avoided looking at, listening to, or even reading the libretto of Barber's version, but rather a decision made so as not in any way to affect my own take on the story.

In 2018 my collaborators, the stage director Elkhanah Pulitzer and our dramaturg Lucia Scheckner, and I set about the daunting task of extracting the core events and essential

characters of Shakespeare's vast canvas. We compared the play to its source text by the first century biographer Plutarch, being cognizant that Plutarch's historical spin, like that of Virgil's, had to be pleasing to his Roman readers. It goes without saying that for purposes of opera, numerous ancillary events and characters had to be either compressed or deleted in favor of a focus on the three main characters, the third of course being the young "scarce

bearded" Caesar. (In the play Shakespeare's "Caesar" is not the Julius Caesar of Cleopatra's early liaison but rather his adopted nephew who at the time of these events was called Octavian, only later to rebrand himself Caesar Augustus). I enjoyed Shakespeare's take on Caesar, whose laser-focused ambition and precocious brilliance comes hand in hand with a humorless, sometimes petulant personality. Like some Silicon Valley master of the universe, he is always on message, always seems to get it right, while the aging, ambivalent Antony, consumed by love and pleasure, goes from one embarrassing defeat to another and cannot even manage his own suicide without bungling it.

I rued the necessary loss of many scenes, not the least of which was the wine-soaked frat party aboard Pompey's ship and the keenly poignant breakup between Antony and his comrade-in-arms Enobarbus. Many details and critical information that would fly by in a matter of seconds in a spoken play when treated musically had to be radically

reduced, repurposed, or even omitted. We condensed several battles between the Romans and the Egyptians into one. Lines originally spoken by characters absent in our version would now be given to others, as when in the opening of the play two of Antony's veteran soldiers, disgusted with their commander's louche behavior and fascination with Cleopatra, now are sung by an equally annoyed Caesar:

“Take but good note, and you shall see in him
The triple pillar of the world transformed
Into a strumpet's fool.”

A surprise discovery was that, compared to other plays from that astonishingly fruitful late period of Shakespeare's, *Antony and Cleopatra* has relatively few stand-alone soliloquies. At one key dramatic point I found I needed for Caesar some sort of statement or expression of Roman superiority and imperial “manifest destiny.” There being nothing quite adequately concise in the play to fit that, I went to *The Aeneid* (in a translation by Dryden) to fill that gap.

Every operatic adaption of a famous text is fraught with difficult, often painful decisions. Composers set out with the intention of absolute fidelity to the original, but both musical and dramatic concerns immediately get in the way. It's messy business. If it isn't, the end result is likely to be dull and rigid.

I was able to take heart from looking at the quicksilver alchemy of Boito's treatment of the Falstaff comedies. Lucia was creative in mining fragments from other Shakespeare plays such as *The Taming of the Shrew*, *Henry V*, and *Richard II* to extend or enrich certain moments. And when the need for filling in critical narrative data threatened to bog down the opera's natural flow, I could remind myself that music, being the most psychologically precise of all the arts, has the unique power to replace event with feeling and that a single change in the harmony can convey more emotional and psychological meaning than dozens of lines of text.

After forty years of setting texts in three languages I wish I could say I now have a formula, but I don't, and perhaps that's a good thing. The influence of American popular music has for sure had a stronger effect on my way of putting music to language than anything I may have learned from the great European classical tradition. I grew up listening to my mother singing Rodgers and Hammerstein and Cole Porter while she was cooking or doing housework or taking part in local amateur musicals. In my youth it was impossible not to hear Frank Sinatra or Ella Fitzgerald on the radio, and by the time I got to college the great era of early rock and soul had begun. In the best of all this music,

whether it was The Beatles or Stevie Wonder or The Supremes, text, melody, and harmony were married together in a perfect unity. I now see that in my own treatment of text I honed closely to that model, responding not just to the rhythm of word phrase but to the sound of the individual syllables themselves. I never had the least interest in conventional operatic *floritura*, nor was I inclined to utilize virtuoso “extended” vocal techniques that became the rage in midcentury avant-garde works. When I listened to many classic twentieth-century atonal works—whether by Schoenberg, Berg, Berio, or Boulez—their often-punishing sequences of intervallic leaps, easily accomplished on a piano, to me communicated a feeling of physical and emotional stress when sung. Such treatment of the voice was germane to express madness or exaggerated emotional states (*Erwartung*, *Wozzeck*, *Le Grand Macabre*) but it seemed to me that the anatomy of human vocal cords want naturally to fall in with the acoustical laws of resonance, what we in the Western tradition call tonality.

When in *Doctor Atomic* I came to set the John Donne sonnet “Batter my heart, three-person'd God,” the monosyllabic verbs, “knock, breathe, shine ... break, blow, burn” felt to me like strokes of a hammer, and I treated them as such (much to the horror of a Donne scholar who protested that in so doing I'd destroyed the scansion of the poem!).

Shakespeare, of course, is so inherently musical that the internal rhythms all but suggest their own melodic shapes. That doesn't mean, however, that everything to my American ears falls in neat, tidy symmetrical units. I hear his texts in distinctly different ways than, for instance, Handel or Benjamin Britten would. We composers all try to honor the text in our individual way, and mine often can drive singers to despair as they cope with miniscule irregularities in the rhythmic structure; difficulties, I'm happy to say, that usually disappear and feel natural once the music's become internalized.

I write this on the very day that rehearsals for the San Francisco premiere begin. One never knows how different the reality will be from what began in the mind's eye, but I am fairly certain that *Antony and Cleopatra*, in comparison to all my earlier stage works, differs by being the most actively dramatic. There are fewer stand-alone set pieces (arias, choruses, etc.). In their place I tried to maintain a fast-moving interaction among the characters. These characters, rather than pondering in song their doubts, designs, or motivations, act on them directly. In this sense, although it is of course musically much different, the model of “sung drama” that Debussy imagined in *Pelléas et Mélisande* is probably the closest to my aims. 🌿

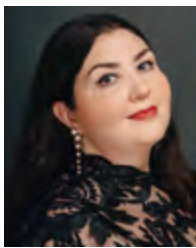

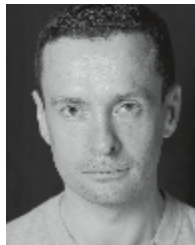

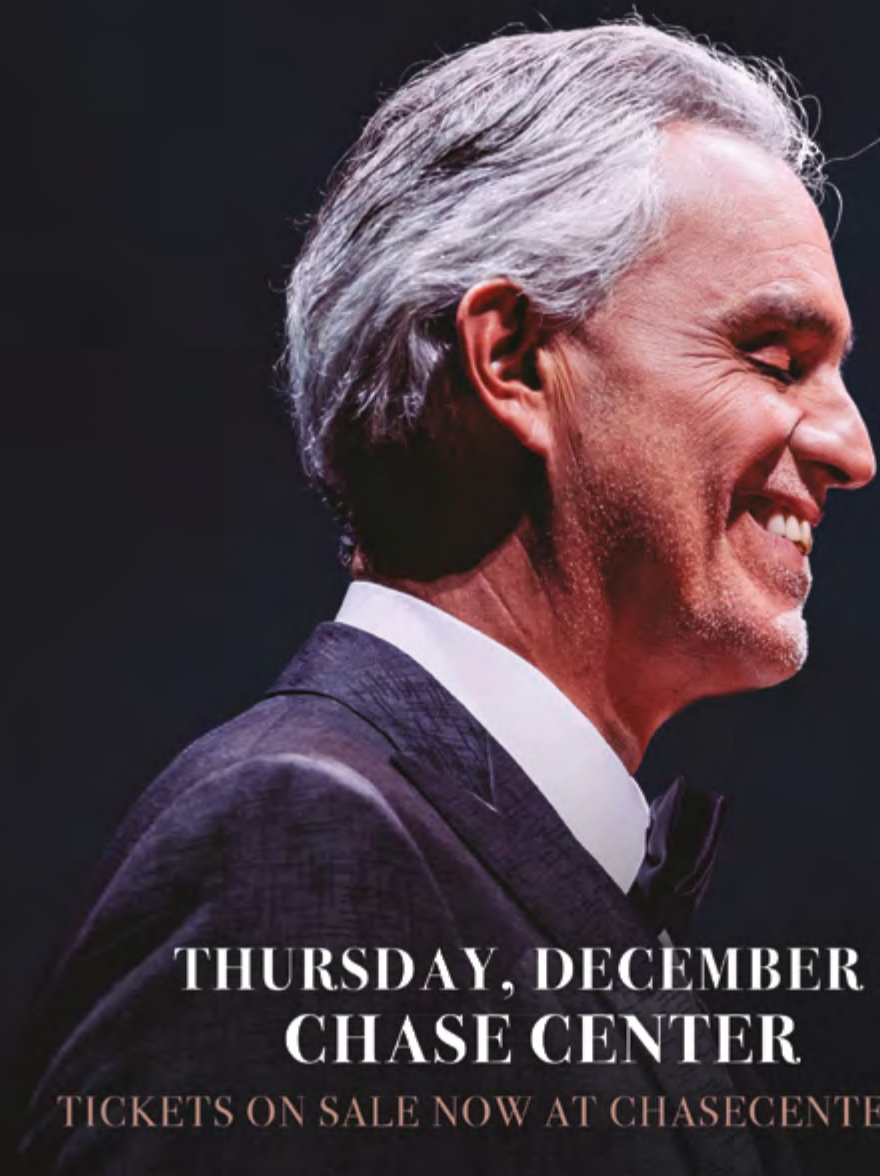

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Hair and Makeup Edition

San Francisco Opera's Head of Hair and Makeup (since 2014) Jeanna Parham chats with longtime friend, mentor, and colleague Stan Dufford who was San Francisco Opera's Head of Wigs (1956–1968) and Makeup (1962–1968) and who served as Wigs and Makeup Journeyman/Foreman (1999–2010). Jeanna Parham: I think you and I met probably in 2002 or '03. You and I had some very great conversations and bonded over floating boxes across the stage for no reason, and that began our friendship.

Stan Dufford: Yes. And it's lasted a long time!

JP: I'm very happy about that. You've been volunteering in the Archive since 2011 but your history with this Company—[and] the hair and makeup industry not just [in] San Francisco, but across the nation—your influence is what started a lot of the techniques that are used in opera still to this day because you trained the people that trained us.

SD: I taught makeup at San Francisco State and taught Gerd Mairandres, Judy Disbrow, Richard Battle, etc., and they, in turn, spread that knowledge and technique. Richard Stead was one of my early students, and he founded a school that taught wig and makeup. And so there was a continuum.

JP: I'd love if you could talk a little bit about your early days, and how you came here to San Francisco Opera.

SD: I went to Japan when I was in the Navy and got to see Kabuki theater, which I found absolutely fascinating. And while I was in Tokyo I bought Kabuki makeup, a Kabuki wig, (laughter) etc. When I got out of the Navy, I did graduate work at San Francisco State ... The next summer, there was a call to the Drama Department from a man who rented the Opera's lighting equipment, and he asked if there was anybody there who knew anything about wigs—and the head of the Drama Department suggested me. I met with [former Stage Director] Matt Farruggio. He took me into the

basement and pulled out three wigs—a white tieback; a woman's eighteenth-century white wig; and a Japanese wig—and said, “Style these” and left. I styled the two white wigs. When I was in Tokyo I bought a booklet on how to style Japanese wigs, and so I did that one, too. Jeanna, you would not believe what the wig was: just a skullcap with rosa web sewn around the outside, nothing in the middle!

JP: Oh, gosh!

SD: But I did a good approximation, because Matt hired me, and that's how I got started! I really wasn't a wigmaker. I considered myself a makeup artist. But I became proficient.

JP: I would say a little bit better than proficient! How was your experience going from SF State into the world of opera? Were you prepared?

SD: No, I wasn't. I had not worked in theater, and what also worked against me was that the Opera was a bit of chaos ... My first opera rehearsal was a disaster. It was *Manon Lescaut*. I had styled some brown tiebacks and some white tiebacks, and when the choristers came to the wig room door, I said, "Are you a bourgeoisie or a noble?" [One] said, "I don't know. I enter stage left and I sing *la, la, la*." I said, "Well, is your costume satin or is it like upholstery fabric?" "I don't know." Well, of course, everybody got mixed up. And there were no wig fittings ever! I also knew nothing about any rules. There was no union at that time, and it was just catch-as-catch-can.

JP: You've said that a lot of artists brought their own wigs ...

SD: Oh, yes. In the 1950s and '60s it was not unusual for divas to bring their own wig. However, in the case of [soprano] Elisabeth Schwarzkopf, she would bring a bag full of wigs and deposit it with me, and then on the day of the dress rehearsal, or even on the day of opening night, she would change her mind! When we did *Così* in 1960, I learned beforehand that, you know, you can't change anything in Mozart. Guglielmo is one color; and Ferrando is another color ... I went to Schwarzkopf's room to put on her wig, and I just casually mentioned that although I had dressed a black wig for Despina, [soprano] Mary Costa had brought her own red wig, and Schwarzkopf said, "A black wig? Oh, Stanley, you must get it. Go, go." So at 20 minutes to curtain I ran to the basement, picked up the black wig, and we put it on her and we had to restyle it. "Higher, Stanley, higher!" (laughter) Meantime, Maestro Adler is knocking on the door, and she wouldn't let him in. She was almost giggling as we were doing this. When it was time to go on stage, she went out and her colleagues just were agog. That's what she wanted. She wanted a frisson of excitement.

JP: And she got it.

SD: She was very good at that!

JP: I would love to hear about the *Madame Butterfly* from 1966 and the Japanese wigs.

SD: Well, our Japanese wigs were not wonderful, but Nathaniel Merrill came from the Met to direct *Butterfly*, and he insisted that we use absolutely authentic Japanese wigs. And I said, "Oh, please, please no. It would be a disaster. You can't pin them on. They're made on a metal frame, and our chorus is not used to that." And it was true. They were beautiful, absolutely beautiful, but the chorus women would come in and shake their heads and say, "My

wig is gonna come off." And I said, "Yes, if you keep on shaking your head like that, it might come off." (laughter)

JP: I love that because when I first took over for [former Wig Master] Gerd I had known that at some point we used real geisha wigs from Japan, but I never knew the story. I had a crate brought over from the warehouse, and inside we still had three of them in the original 1966 case. And we all looked inside of it and thought, no way could we get anyone to wear this now ... But we still keep it, and we'd like to put it on display because this is what we used for many productions and they were so beautiful and authentic. I just wanted you to know that they live on, Stan. (laughter) Leontyne Price, you did her street wigs as well, right?

SD: Yes.

JP: You guys had a great relationship. Maybe you could tell some fun stuff about the two of you.

SD: In 1960 ... I met up with her in Milan. I remember the Italian men were crazy about her, and they kept saying things. And I said, "What are they saying?" She says, "Relax, honey, it's all complimentary." She liked the Carabinieri, because they were all tall and good looking, and she says, "I don't know who does the choosin' but they sure know what they're doin'!" (laughter) She was great fun to be with. I really loved working with her.

JP: What's your favorite memory of your tenure here?

SD: I enjoy so much working with people—like Schwarzkopf, Price, Sutherland—just the memories of working with them, rather than one particular highlight.

JP: I feel the same way. We have such wonderful singers who come through here that it's those moments with them that make the show for me, more so than the show itself because we in hair and makeup ... we're in the room with them.

SD: We're the counselor, the shrink, the ...

JP: The confidant.

SD: The confidant, yeah.

JP: We're there with them through thick and through thin, and, you know, whether we like it or not, we gotta get those eyelashes on! 🍷

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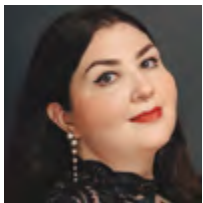
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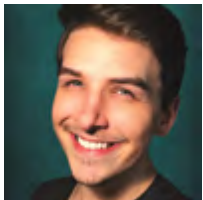
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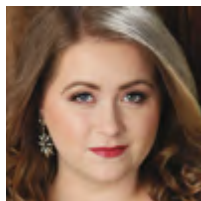
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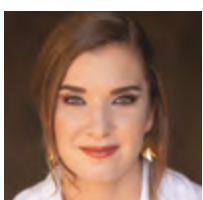
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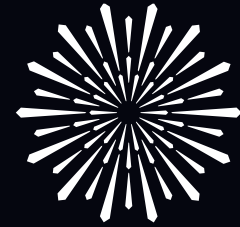
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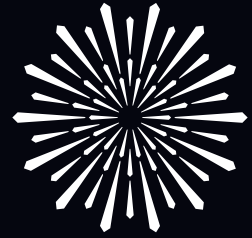
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Defining the Future

On October 25, 2017, John Adams and I had lunch together at Hayes Street Grill. It was about a month before we were to premiere his latest opera, *Girls of the Golden West*, and, despite how busy we were with rehearsals, I had to ask him a pressing question: would he write a new opera to open our Centennial Season?

Five years out from the centennial, we were just beginning to put together the framework for this most important of seasons, and we knew for certain that we wanted to begin with a new opera. While our centennial would need to honor the past, we wanted to send a clear message that the centennial was, even more so, the beginning of a new chapter.

To be able to even ask John Adams to write an opera is an honor, irrespective of the answer! John has championed new directions in opera for the last 35 years, ever since *Nixon in China* opened the Wortham Center in Houston under the general directorship of my mentor, David Gockley. John has been on the forefront of crafting an ever-evolving American musical language that holds up a mirror to society writ large. He helps us see ourselves with all our foibles and triumphs. His operas have energized our stage in San Francisco more than any other living composer. And, based in Berkeley, he is a neighbor, a member of the community, a friend. Opening our second century with a new opera by John made sense on every level. I asked my question with trepidation ...

John not only embraced the idea, he soon had a direction. He had spent that year reading every play by Shakespeare, and *Girls of the Golden West* included two soliloquies from the Scottish play (Shakespeare was routinely staged by the gold miners). John's setting of Shakespeare suggested that a collaboration with the Bard could yield extraordinary results. The incision, perception, and clarity of John's text setting allows Shakespeare to leap off the page in very contemporary and comprehensible ways. And, when he selected *Antony and Cleopatra*, with its empire-sized passion and intensity, it was clear that something red hot could emerge from this. And it has!

Over the course of the pandemic, I've had the privilege to visit with John at his home in Berkeley and sit outside with him, listening to each scene unfold. His work with our director Elkhanah Pulitzer and dramaturg Lucia Scheckner has created a tight, energized libretto that cuts to the core of this intercontinental power triangle. John's musical score pulls us into both the vastness and vulnerability of this story with an emotional veracity that is so intense that it leaves us listeners out of breath.

Just a few months ago, the Nonesuch record label released a 40-disc commemorative set of recordings of John's work, celebrating his 75th birthday. It is a beautiful collection, reproducing original album covers and smartly leaving room in the box for things still to come! As I held the set in my hands recently, I felt the enormity of what we are embarking upon here. Yes, John is the composer next door, but he is also the composer that the world of classical music looks to to define what comes next.

We get to hear that first, here in San Francisco! 🎭

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
